Innovation Mission on Advancing Sustainable Livestock Farming in Kenya

The Embassy of the Netherlands in partnership with The Netherlands Enterprise Agency (RVO) and the Ministry of Agriculture, Nature and Food Quality of the Netherlands hosted a mission comprising of 14 companies and institutions from the Netherlands working on various areas along the dairy value chain ranging from genetics, production, processing, feed, forage, knowledge and training.

Capital Africa Agribusiness Ventures: Responsible Reforestation

Kenya aims to increase forest cover from 7% to 10% in 10 years, combating deforestation due to agriculture, charcoal production, and poor management. Capital Africa Agribusiness Ventures Ltd pioneers agroforestry in Koromi Farm, addressing ecological and financial goals through rainwater harvesting, diverse revenue streams, and ecosystem restoration. Scaling up the project promises to sell carbon and biodiversity credits, supporting communities in sustainable income generation and forest conservation.







Fostering a sustainable and future-proof feed value chain in Kenya

In March 2024, key players in the Kenyan animal feed industry convened in Nairobi for a groundbreaking roundtable discussion. Organized by Lattice and Larive International, in partnership with ASNET and AKEFEMA, and sponsored by the Netherlands Enterprise Agency and the Embassy, this event brought together 108 sector participants to explore strategies for building a better and more sustainable feed supply chain.

The competition signifies a promising future for sustainable aquaculture in Kenya, with a focus on youth and gender diversity.

Dutch Animal Nutrition Company Breaks Ground For Ksh3B Feed Mill Plant In Kenya

De Heus Animal Nutrition, a multinational with operations in over 20 countries, of which six are in Africa, has commenced construction of a Ksh3 billion (USD 23 million) animal feed production plant in Athi River, in Machakos County.

The factory, with an annual capacity of 200,000 metric tonnes (MT), will become operational during the second half of 2025, catering to the needs of the poultry, swine and dairy farming sectors in the country.

Financial Sector Visit


In February 2024, a Dutch delegation visited Kenya, focusing on FMO investments' impact on local communities and economy.
