Workshop on Calf Rearing

In this workshop Dmytro Nechyporuk of CHV Korm will give you the answers how to implement different feeding strategies to achieve maximum development of your calves. Questions he will answer are:

- What products makes your calves grow the best?
- What managerial actions are essential for a perfect start?
- How do you get the most out of your genetics?

Workshop on the linear evaluation

Huub Peek together with CZRS (www.czrs.com.ua) will explain in their workshop the differences in mating recommendations (by the M84Uprogram) for individual cows based on linear evaluation and pedigree-data.

Over the last year Huub has been working intensively with the evaluation-team of CZRS to work on their skills, both in linear evaluation as on genetics pedigrees and mating service. At the DDD-workshop and based on some cows present, he will explain why and how a mating program recommends the specific bulls to individual cows based on aspects as pedigree, genetic defects and differences in linear scores. All with the goal to help farmers to breed for a uniform herd of efficient, healthy long-lasting cows.

Workshop: How to breed a profitable and healthy cow with new insights?

During the workshop Eric Lievens - specialist in the field of animal breeding and breeding advice at CRV will share their knowledge about getting better contents of fat and protein in milk, better leg and claw health, better mobility, higher life time production, higher life-time production, better feed efficiency and higher fertility rates.

Workshop on benchmarking

Talking about milk quality, Ryan will focus on the importance of a low cell count and the absence of antibiotic violation in the milk and how to achieve this in practice. If the farmer produces milk from healthy cows the milk processor can make good quality products of this milk that can be sold for a good price and most important the milk processor can pay a good price to the farmer. Observations in milking parlour are key for further improvement of milk quality.

Healthy cows with good quality and healthy milk will give good return on investment for farmer and milk processor and as a whole, have a sustainable profitable dairy industry.
