On Friday the 28th of May, during the 'Africa Business Week', a successful session was organized by the Dutch Ministry of Agriculture, Nature and Food Quality on the importance of animal feed as input for the development of a sustainable livestock value chain in Ethiopia.

Ethiopian National Elections

On 22nd of June, our team compiled several articles from the Ethiopian press and summarized it on our Agroberichten Buitenland Website. The sixth national election in Ethiopia were held on June 21st and turned out to be a rather peaceful one.

Voters were standing in line since the crack of dawn to cast their ballots in what is the country's first elections in six years. The election was postponed twice in the past year but further delay was not made despite the conflict in Tigray that has erupted since last November (no date has been set for elections there) and the problem in the two regions, Somali and Harar, which previously delayed voting until September.

Moyale-Moyale starts operating as a one stop border crossing point

June 8th marks the start of Moyale Border operating as a One Stop Border Post (OSBP), as the Government border regulatory officials from Kenya and Ethiopia came together to commence operations.

This means that, the border regulatory officials clearing traffic, cargo and persons from both Ethiopia and Kenya will now physically relocate and sit side by side on either side of the border, where they will undertake exit and entry formalities in a joint and/or sequenced manner.

The officials conducted site visits and inspection of border facilities as part of the OSBP operations commencement process.

EU donates 42 field vehicles to support the Coffee industry in Ethiopia

As <u>reported</u> in the Ethiopian Monitor, the European Union in Addis Ababa, has donated Forty-two field vehicles worth €1.3mln to support the development of coffee sector in Ethiopia.

The donation is expected to support the research and extension service delivery of the 28 main coffee growing districts as well as the activities of Ethiopian Coffee and Tea Authority(ECTA), and Jimma Agricultural Research Centre, according to the EU Delegation in Addis Ababa.

Ethiopia Declares An Immediate, Unilateral Ceasefire In Tigray

As <u>reported</u> in the NPR, Ethiopia's government on Monday 28th of June, declared an immediate, unilateral cease-fire in its Tigray region after nearly eight months of deadly conflict and as hundreds of thousands of people face the world's worst famine crisis in a decade.

The cease-fire could calm a war that has destabilized Africa's second most populous country and threatened to do the same in the wider Horn of Africa, where Ethiopia has been seen as a key security ally for the West.

MoA drafts plan for bank formation

Aimed to support small and medium farmers', the Ministry of Agriculture (MoA) submits its final draft plan to the micro economy team for the formation of the agricultural policy bank.

The agricultural bank is expected to be formed mainly with the aim to expand access to finance for the sector that has been working on the plan for the last three years starting from pointing out problems and solutions on the sector.

Effective policy implementation to augment agricultural products' export volume

Interesting facts and figures shared in this article.

Currently, Ethiopia receives 76 percent of its export earnings from its agricultural products such as Coffee, Oilseeds, Chat, Pulses, Cut Flowers, Fruits, Vegetables, Dairy and meat among others. The first 5 commodities cover 28.7 percent, 14.5 percent, 11.4 percent, 10.2 percent and 9.6 percent of the volume exported in 2018/19 respectively. Major export destinations in 2018/2019 included Asia (41.6 percent), Europe (25.4%), and Africa (20.8 percent).
