Moody's Cuts Ethiopia's Credit Rating Second Time Since May

Moody's Investors Service cut Ethiopia's sovereign credit rating for a second time since May, citing a delay in the nation's planned debt restructuring and an escalating civil war.

The yield on Ethiopia \$1 billion of Eurobonds climbed five basis points to a record 13.83%. The rate on the debt has more than doubled since November 2020, when conflict erupted in Ethiopia's dissident Tigray region.

Tax Regulations No. 410/ 2016 lacks sufficient clarity for its proper application and has negatively impacted some economic activities, the Council of Ministers on its 100th ordinary meeting clarifies the controversy surrounding the regulation. The National Bank of Ethiopia (NBE) Amends Recent Loan Regulation

According to the article on <u>The Reporter</u>, the NBE is to ease the recently placed loan regulations, against lending on mobile assets and indebted banks for indefinite loans. It has announced that banks can now approve 5 types of loans:

- For buyers who wish to buy auctioned assets listed by the bank, to repay debts
- Transaction between second and third parties on areas that the NBE now allows loans
- Emergency loans to bank employees
- Requests for loans from trusted and approved organizations, and employees who meet the requirements to purchase houses
- For sesame growers in Gonder area, considering the season

Abiy Ahmed Ali has been re-elected as prime minister Of Ethiopia. He has appointed Ministerial cabinets and officials of high level Federal Positions

According to <u>this</u> article on Fana Broadcasting, The 6th House of Peoples Representatives, in its founding session, has re-elected Abiy Ahmed Ali (PhD) as Prime Minister of Ethiopia on October 4, 2021.

Accordingly, Abiy Ahmed (PhD) was officially sworn in as a Prime Minister by the President of Supreme Court of Ethiopia for a second term.

The House of Peoples Representatives has approved his nominated Ministerial level cabinet members including reappointment of Demeke Mekonnen Hassen as Deputy Prime Minister and Foregin Minister. Apart from members of Prosperity party, three contending parties' leaders have been included as cabinet members. Find the list of newly appointed Ministers here.

Bad sign' as IMF withholds Ethiopia growth forecast

African Business has reported in the article here that in a rare move reserved for war-torn countries and failed states, the IMF has not released a GDP growth forecast for Ethiopia in its latest World Economic Outlook for the next four years.

The only other countries excluded from the projections are Afghanistan, Libya and Syria.

While the IMF makes no explicit reference to the Tigray war, analysts say that the ongoing conflict is the most likely reason why the multilateral lender has withheld its predictions for Ethiopia's economic recovery in 2022.

Ethiopian Airlines, Djibouti Free Zone Launch Sea-Air Cargo Operation

The first Sea-Air Cargo Operation that discharge 17 tons of electronic and home appliances from Shenzen to Lagos and Kano in Nigeria via Djibouti is launched on Thursday.

As the leading air cargo service provider in Africa, Ethiopian Airlines, coupled with the competitive geostrategic advantage Djibouti has, this project, when fully operational, will double the cargo operation of the Airlines and make Djibouti a hub for sea-Air cargo logistics.

Sea-Air cargo project that is twice as fast as the sea only and twice as cheap as the Air only transportation is expected to massively scale up trade relations between Africa and Asia.

Draft bill obligates banks to secure timely deposit of pension funds

A draft bill presented to the House of Peoples' Representatives (HPR) sets to impose on banks and related financial institutions a duty to deduct/transfer from accounts of private organizations that collect pension from their employees but fail to deposit the money timely to the Pension Fund.

According to the bill, banks and other financial institutions that are required to implement the decision must apply the order without any precondition and if the institutions fail to do so, they might be obliged to pay the liability. Food Inflation Hits 42pc

The rate of inflation for food items has reached a staggering 42pc, a latest report from the Central Statistics Agency revealed.

Fast depreciation of the Birr against major currencies and dearth in the supply of food items have contributed to the inflationary pressure.

Subject : NBE Instruction

Please be informed that NBE has instructed us further to the exemptions issued so far regarding restrictions on loan disbursement, this is to inform you that the National Bank has issued additional exemption for **businesses engaged in the production and export of horticulture sector and Companies Supplying Petroleum Products** in line with an agreement entered with **Ethiopian Petroleum Supply Enterprise** effective from October 27, 2021. For sake of clarity, please note that this exemption, for the time being, does not include petroleum dealers.



Additional Exemption on Loan Restriction

The National Bank of Ethiopia has issued additional exemption regarding restrictions on loan disbursement as reported by <u>Business info Ethiopia</u>.

According to this exemption, business engaged in the production and export of horticultural sector and companies supplying petroleum products are exempted effective from October 27, 2021.

This exemption, however, doesn't include petroleum dealers.

Ethiopia: Avocado Export

Farmers in 9 agricultural clusters in the Amhara region will soon begin exporting Hass avocados cultivated on 200 hectares of land.

447 farmers in North Mecha Woreda of West Gojjam Zone are participating in the export process; Out of which 156 farmers collected, prepared, weighed, packed & exported avocadoes weighing more 1600 quintals for the international market. In the same way, preparation has commenced to export these types of avocados in the Oromia region.

Agrofood & plastprintpack Ethiopia


