

Climate change adaptation strategies for farmers in Ethiopia

The study analyzed the livelihood strategies of rural households and determinants of their choices for climate change adaptation using Harresaw and Shumsheha communities in the Tigray and Amhara regions respectively. The results of the study showed that farmlevel adjustments were still a primary choice of climate adaptation strategies among rural households in both study areas.

The Ethiopian Communication Authority (ECA) has confirmed that the final preparations are underway to award the license to a deserving candidate.

Ethiopian Airlines Group is set to launch a cutting-edge global e-commerce enterprise, in partnership with e-commerce giants Alibaba and Amazon, among other collaborators. Ethiopian Investment Holdings (EIH) has confirmed that it has completed all the necessary preparations to sell a 75 percent stake on the Ethiopian Securities Exchange (ESX), with the remaining 25 percent to be owned by the government. Officials of the Holdings stated that a feasibility study has been completed and the required documents have been prepared for the sale of shares.

Lack of forex to import fertilizer threatens agricultural output



Fertilizer procurement for the following year faces hurdles as acute forex shortages cause the Ministry of Agriculture to experience delays in the opening of letters of credit (LCs). Over 7.7 million quintals of fertilizer have been left stranded as the Commercial Bank of Ethiopia (CBE) has yet to open a letter of credit, which is required to pay suppliers.

As mentioned on the <u>TheReporter</u> News in <u>here</u>, the bill for fertilizer imports has skyrocketed in recent years and more than doubled in the last year to USD 1.2 billion. The rise first began as a result of the coronavirus pandemic, with the Ukraine-Russia conflict worsening the situation.

Agriculture Ministry Envisage Machinery Inspection, Training Centre to Hoist Mechanized Farming

As stated in <u>this article</u>, uniform standards and inspections on imported and locally manufactured agricultural machinery are nearing sight following the agreement to establish agricultural mechanization centre.

The centre is expected to foster a training hub for maintenance. Officials hope to enhance the inspection capacity through agricultural technologies that have prevented the Ministry from enforcing over 250 standards.

New Legislations Hope to Amend Agricultural Futile Policy

A contract farming regulation that sets up four types of agreements between contractor and producer was ratified by Parliamentarians, along with a wave of reforms to seed variety ownership and use.

The new law states all contracts will need to be in writing and include the type of agricultural produce, pricing mechanism for both input and produce, size of the production site and set the quantity and units of measurement along with customary requirements of other contractual standards. Farmers endure market sabotage, inflation and price disorientation as government wheat export story takes news headlines by storm



wheat prices shot through the roof following the announcement of the Ethiopian PM Dr. Abiy Ahmed as reported on the <u>Addis Standard News</u> in <u>this</u> article.

While the instant price hike is the immediate reaction, however, economists, farmers and observers have been arguing the wheat market sabotage among stakeholders has resulted in shortage of supply and skyrocketing of price, long before the announcement, and after the government's decision to intervene in the market to buy wheat products from farmers at a pre-set prices and export to foreign countries, in what came as a bid to resolve the dire shortage of hard currency the country is facing.

Joining forces with OCO Global, Triple Line and critical stakeholders in Ethiopia, the project aims to attract anchor investors to explore lucrative opportunities in Ethiopia's thriving Agro-processing sector. Forex Crunch Inflames Agro-Industrial Parks' Inadequate Power Supply

The Bure, Bulbula and Yirga Alem parks are hindered from manufacturing at maximum capacity for a lack of adequate electricity.

Ethiopia's coffee exports have generated \$896.7 million in revenue over the past nine months, falling short of its planned target of \$1.19 billion. Gov't shifts gear to ensure PPP projects come to life

The board of directors of the National Bank of Ethiopia (NBE) aligns strategies in the form of convertibility guarantees and proclamation amendments to anchor the public private partnership (PPP) initiative which is yet to take a foothold in the country's vital mega projects landscape.

Experts in PPP Directorate General, which is under the MoF, disclosed that the decision was passed to give a guarantee for projects that have big values for the country as mentioned in <u>this</u> article.
