Ethiopia's Parliament approved a budget of Birr 802bn for 2023-24, 2% increase from previous year. The budget aims to reduce deficit and lower inflation, but unfavorable spending patterns persist with rising debt service and falling capital expenditure. Cepheus has more on this in the link below:

The State of Food Security and Nutrition in the World 2023

As indicated by World Bank, Ethiopia's GDP growth reached 6.4% in FY22, but slows due to COVID-19, food and supply disruptions, and exhausted fiscal and external buffers. Peace in northern Ethiopia presents an opportunity to restore macroeconomic balance and revive reforms for growth and poverty reduction.

ATI, EU & France Launch A 5-Year FARM Project Worth €32mln

The Ethiopian Agricultural Transformation Institute (ATI) launched the Food Security and Agriculture Rehabilitation Measures in Conflict Affected Regions of Ethiopia (FARM) project financed by the French Development Agency (AFD) and the European Union (EU) in Addis Ababa. As stated in here, the project aims to contribute to food security efforts in Ethiopia by re-launching resilient agricultural activity in conflict-affected regions and improving agricultural productivity by strengthening the seed sector and agroecological practices.

Ethiopia Paves the Way for Legalizing Informal Trade Along Djibouti, South Sudan Border

The Ethiopian Ministry of Trade and Regional Integration (MoTRI) have proposed legislation designed to stimulate cross-border trade with South Sudan and Djibouti, following over a year of economic stagnation in the broader region.

As per the provisions outlined in the soon-to be-enacted legislation will allow cross-border trade between Ethiopia and Djibouti to transport goods and export seven commodities without taxes, including livestock, animal products, fruits, vegetables, and corn.

Ministry Calls For Swift Distribution Of Imported Soil Fertilizer To Regions and Considers Private Imports to Tackle Fertilizer Crisis

Ethiopia's Ministry of Agriculture urges swift distribution of soil fertilizer from Djibouti port to Addis Ababa, addressing over 20 trucks without unloading. According to this article, Minister Sophia Kasa directs unloading and distribution, and entrusts Agricultural Works Corporation officials to increase stevedores.

In an audacious move to rejuvenate the agricultural sector, the Ethiopian federal authorities are contemplating allowing the private sector to import fertilizer (possibly through franco valuta) challenging the state's monopoly over a sector worth billions of dollars. The potential transition comes as part of a broader plan, as the country grapples with securing foreign currency needed to pay for imports. Seven logistics firms rejected for multimodal licenses

The Ethiopian Maritime Authority (EMA) has rejected bids from seven logistics companies seeking multimodal operating licenses, including the French Bollore Transport & Logistics as read on the <u>The Reporter News</u> in here.

The Authority had floated a tender seeking bids from companies interested in four new multimodal licenses and operating certificates. This followed a government decision to increase the number of multimodal providers to five, including the Ethiopian Shipping and Logistics Enterprise.

Ethiopia's birr plunges as currency crisis worsens, posing serious challenges for economy

The local currency, the birr, has been experiencing a longstanding decline in value against major international currencies, most notably the US dollar.

However, the current state of affairs has reached unprecedented levels, with the exchange rate soaring to unparalleled heights. With the official rate currently hovering around 55 birr per dollar, the scarcity of hard currency has now driven the black-market value of a dollar to exceed 110 birr. NBE Will Focus On Reducing Inflation Via Monetary Policy Measures: Governor

The Governor of Ethiopia's central bank said in his speech at the opening of the 20th Ethiopian Economics Association International Conference on Ethiopia's economy "A 'cocktail of challenges' is facing the global economy including high inflation, rising debt, and a particularly sharp funding squeeze facing African countries". He pulled no punches in acknowledging citizens are struggling with an unrelenting cost of living surge.



He said to address the current mix of challenges, NBE will focus on reducing inflation via monetary policy measures, ensuring the financial sector is stable, modernized, and inclusive. Read more in here.

Addis-Djibouti Corridor to Get Major Upgrade

According to the Website of the World Bank which can be found here, the Addis-Djibouti corridor, a vital trade route and a lifeline for Ethiopia's 120 million people, will get a significant upgrade thanks to the newly approved Horn of Africa Initiative's Regional Economic Corridor Project. The project, endowed with a \$730 million grant from the International Development Association(IDA), aims to improve regional connectivity and logistics efficiency in Ethiopia along this key trade route connecting landlocked Ethiopia to the port of Djibouti.

ESL fuels strategy to drive its logistics ambitions

State owned vessels operator, Ethiopian Shipping and Logistics (ESL), designs a strategic plan to go head and shoulders above the rest in the coming few years. The logistics mammoth plans to boost its foreign currency generation by six folds from cross trade, expand its carrying capacity by 3.6 folds and containers ownership by 7.7 folds. The enterprise which successfully swapped its vessel tankers with huge Ultramax disclosed that its vessel ownership will be increased in the coming five years. Read more in here.

Astronomical imbalance on sugar supply-demand raises alarm

The Ethiopian Ministry of Trade and Regional Integration (MoTRI) reveals that only ten percent of the national demand for sugar has been fulfilled this year. Ethiopian Sugar Industry Group supplied 10% of Ethiopia's sugar demand in the 2022/23 budget report, according to MoTRI. The sector experts critiqued the failure of the Group which led to the inability to secure the sugar for the last two years, which in turn disrupted the market. Read more in here.

CBI launched a new project in Ethiopia

On July 13, 2023, The Netherlands Centre for the Promotion of Imports (CBI) launched a new project in Ethiopia called 'Transitioning Ethiopian horticulture to a Sustainable Export Alternative' (To SEA) in Addis Ababa with the presence of the Ethiopian Agricultural Authority, the private sector and developmental partners from the agricultural and logistics sector.



The project aims to support the Ethiopian horticulture sector in growing the export of fruits and vegetables (F&V) by strengthening the service and increasing the sustainability and competitiveness of the sector. CBI and Ethiopian Agricultural Authority (EAA) have signed a Memorandum of Understanding to collaborate in the field of phytosanitary services, agro-logistics and quality inputs.
