

Ethiopian Shipping and Logistics (ESL) has commenced the export of live animals from the newly launched international standard quarantine facility built in Mille, Afar Region. ESL has transported the first 7,000 sheep from Mille Quarantine Center to Djibouti Port using 28 trucks. The sheep will be shipped from Djibouti's Doralleh port to Jeddah, Saudi Arabia.

The National Bank of Ethiopia imposed a 14 percent limit on annual credit expansion to reign in high inflation fueled by massive loan growth exceeding 382 billion birr as of February 2023. Authorities aim to reduce inflation pressures as bank lending has boosted money supply.

Leaders of the BRICS nations have come to a consensus regarding the expansion guidelines for admission to the influential multinational association.

Effective 01 January, 2024, six countries will formally become full members of the BRICS, further strengthening its global presence. These countries include Argentina, Egypt, Ethiopia, Iran, Saudi Arabia, and the UAE.

UK, Dutch financiers channel \$40m through Dashen to cultivate underfunded agriculture

As read on <u>The Reporter News</u> in <u>here</u>, British International Investment (BII) and FMO, the Dutch Entrepreneurial Development Bank, have jointly committed up to USD 20 million each to Dashen Bank, one of Ethiopia's largest private banks.

The USD 40 million loan aims to drive agricultural exports and provide much-needed foreign exchange in Ethiopia. BII and FMO are supporting Dashen Bank to bolster the country's agriculture sector, which employs 80 percent of the population and contributes 39 percent to GDP.

Ethiopia, ADF Sign \$84.3mln Grant Agreement To Improve Wheat Productivity





According to this article, on the Fana Broadcasting Corporate News, the Ethiopian Ministry of Finance (MoF) and the African Development Fund (ADF) signed a grant agreement amounting to a total of 84.3 million US dollars (approximately 4.5 billion ETB) from the African Development fund, from the government of Netherlands, from OCP Africa and from global center for adaptation (GCA).

The project is designed to be implemented for the next five years which aims to improve wheat productivity and production thereby increasing the incomes of small-scale wheat farmers in Ethiopia.

ATI, LERSHA Join Hands To Digitize Ethiopian Agriculture

The Ethiopian Agricultural Transformation Institute (ATI) and Lersha, a pioneering private digital agriculture platform in Ethiopia, signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to work together on digitizing Ethiopian agriculture.

According to <u>this</u> article, the MoU focuses on implementation of various digital agriculture services to small holder farmers with a diverse range of priority value chains and inclusive job creation in the farmer production clusters (EPC).

NBE Working on Regulatory Framework to Allow Foreign Banks Operate in Ethiopia

The National Bank of Ethiopia (NBE) is working aggressively to finalize the regulatory framework that allows foreign banks to operate in Ethiopia as stated by the Governor in <u>this article</u>. It is also reported that the bank is working aggressively to deepen financial intermediation and to regulate the financial sector, including banks, so that they can provide better services and accelerate the digitization effort in general.

Ethiopia Cuts Barley Imports, Achieves Self-Sufficiency

According to <u>this article</u>, Ethiopia has become almost fully self-sufficient in barley production in just four years—an unprecedented achievement the International Finance Corporation called a transformation for the country's agriculture.



International agencies and players in the brewery industry, along with authorities, began efforts in 2018 to develop Ethiopia's barley sector after data showed the country was importing a staggering 70 percent of the grains needed by its booming brewing industry. With Ethiopia the fifth largest barley producer in Africa, experts believed the potential was there to drastically cut imports.

Ethiopia Secures Over 3.6 Billion USD From Export Trade

Ethiopia has secured more than 3.6 billion US dollar from export trade during the concluded Ethiopian Fiscal Year (EFY), according to the Ministry of Trade and Regional Integration.

As stated in <u>this article</u>, the revenue gained during the EFY was 69.79 percent of the target. Of the 3.64 Billion US dollar, some 2.8 billion USD was secured from exports of agricultural products, accounting 79.45 percent of the total revenue.

The National Bank of Ethiopia doubles forex retention limit for exporters

The National Bank of Ethiopia (NBE) has decided to double the percentage of foreign currency that Ethiopian exporters can retain from their export earnings. Exporters were only allowed to retain 20 percent of the earnings. The remaining 10 percent had to be surrendered to commercial banks. However, in a decision passed, the NBE has doubled the retention limit for exporters to 40 percent of their foreign exchange proceeds. Now, exporters will have to surrender only 50 percent of the forex earnings to the central bank. The 10 percent share for commercial banks remains unchanged.

Ethiopian Gov.t extends deadlines for eight sugar factories' privatization

Ministry of Finance and Ethiopian Investment Holding (EIH) has extended deadline for the privatization bid to October 5, 2023, which was originally slated for august 3, 2023.

The two institutions, on behalf of Ethiopian government, issued the Expression of Interest (EoI) back in august 2022. Government also disclosed some 20 local and international investors have expressed interest. Nonetheless, the RFP submission and site visits for the eight projects are postponed based on the 'request of potential bidders', according to the statement issued by MoF.

soybean-exporters-battle-processors-for-beans

A surging soybean market is stirring tensions between domestic oil processors and exporters as prices sharply rose to almost 1,000 Br for a quintal in two weeks.

Domestic processors, grappling with a price surge to 4,400 Br for a quintal, are raising an eyebrow at exporters, blaming them for bidding up prices and depleting local supply. Leading the charge is the Ethiopian Edible Oil Manufacturing Industries' Association, which is now pleading for a temporary ban on soybean export in hopes of keeping the edible oil manufacturing sector humming along at its optimal capacity.
