











FOREWORD

Dear all,

I would like to present the 6th edition of the Agricultural export portfolio of Ukraine. Agroportfolio is our annual publication, which certifies the export results of the Ukrainian agri-food sector. It was supposed to be released during autumn 2022 based on the 2021 results of international agricultural trade. However, due to the war in Ukraine, we had to postpone its publication. Still, in this portfolio, we would like to touch on the results of both 2021 and 2022 for Ukrainian agricultural exports.

Without exaggeration, the previous few years were challenging not only for Ukraine but for the whole world: the spread of Covid-19, the closure of borders, and the supply chain disruptions led to the global economic downturn and had consequences worldwide. Despite this, according to the results of 2021, Ukrainian agribusiness generated the fifth part of the domestic GDP, set a record for the harvested grains and oilseeds - 109 mln tons, and achieved impressive figures for agri-food products export – 27.7 bln USD.

2022 questioned the work of all sectors of the Ukrainian economy and the survival of the entire state. Blockades of seaports, spring sowing campaign under constant shelling, heroic harvest in burning fields – this is far from a complete list of challenges that Ukrainian agricultural producers faced during 2022. Despite all, Ukrainian agrarians withstood, maintained a high-quality level of agri-food products and continued supporting world food security. Customers of Ukrainian cereals in Egypt, Algeria, Lebanon, Yemen, Pakistan and other countries that are least protected in food security worldwide continue receiving supplies from Ukraine. The Ukrainian agricultural sector fed more than 400 mln people worldwide every year; this year, probably for the first time in the history of independent Ukraine, the whole world finally learned about it and appreciated our contribution. As of 2022, Ukrainian businesses exported agricultural and food products worth 23.4 bln USD. In war conditions, such indicators are impressive: they testify to the accomplishment of everyone who joined the production process.

This year we would like to express our sincere gratitude to our international partners and allies who support the Ukrainian agricultural industry in wartime conditions.

Owing to European partners, the Solidarity Lanes, logistics routes through the EU countries, were launched, which created conditions for restoring Ukrainian agri-food export. European, British, Canadian and Australian partners liberalized international trade with our country, increasing foreign currency inflow to Ukraine. We are thankful to partners from Turkey and international organizations who helped to start the grain corridor to restore the export of grain and oilseeds by sea and contributed to supporting world food security. However, we are most grateful to the Ukrainians, brave, strong and hardworking, those who continue to work in their places: in the field, behind the wheel of trucks, in factories, and, of course, those defending the country. We are grateful to everyone because everyone on their front contributes to our Victory.

Every figure of the 6th edition of the Agricultural export portfolio of Ukraine shows that the Ukrainian agricultural sector is alive, continues to work and does not plan to stop. This is why the Ministry of Economy of Ukraine, together with the Ministry of Agrarian Policy and Food of Ukraine, will continue to work on expanding export opportunities not only to support and restore the economy and agricultural sector of Ukraine but also to further ensure global food security.


Change in food group export for March-December 2022 vs respective period in 2021 Food group exports in March-December 2022 (Time of War)


Main goods exporting countries in 2021




