### **Financial instruments**

- New Funds Combatting Child Labor The aim of this fund is to eliminate child labor in the production chain of Dutch companies. Deadline: 3 December 2018
- Open: Subsidy for Demonstration projects, Feasibility & Investors Preparation Studies (DHI) - DHI subsidizes demonstration projects, feasibility studies and investment preparation studies. The subsidy is intended for companies that want to carry out a specific project abroad, want to invest in a company or convince potential customers of their technology. Deadline: 21 September 2018.
- Sustainable Development Goals Partnership Facility - A financial instrument to stimulate PPP's that focus on SDG's 2,8 &17. The fund focusses on nutrition, efficient value chains, circular economy in the agro sector and improved income for woman and young adults. Deadline: 1 October 2018

Are Kenyan flowers actually more sustainable? Kenya is the biggest exporter of roses to Europe, transporting almost 160,000 tons of cut flowers in 2017 (KFC). An increasing awareness of the virtues of buying locally has triggered debate around importing flowers. However, Kenya has a perfect climate for natural growth whereas greenhouses are of essential importance in the Netherlands. When taking greenhouse heating and lighting in account, some studies estimate that production in Kenya is 123times more carbon efficient. Including the transport to Europe, Kenyan production still creates 6 times less carbon emission. (*Find out more at Ecolingo.com*)

### Fall Army Worm (FAW) Regulations

The EU established emergency measures, to prevent the introduction into- and the spread within the EU of the harmful organism Spodoptera frugiperda (FAW), came into force on 1 June 2018. The following specified plants will be subjected to requirements, when these are exported. Fruits of Capsicum L., Momordica L., Solanum aethiopicum L., Solanum macrocarpon L. and plants, seeds and grains, of Zea mays L. Refer to (https://eur-lex.europa.eu/eli/ ec\_impl/2018/638/oj)

Farms closer to maize plantations should be cautious, while FAW is not main host of roses the latest data indicate it can be a minor host (https:// www.cabi.org/ISC/datasheet/29810#8ec87468-c467-468c -9073-cc78fd880978)

## **Immigration alert**

Due to the administrative and policy changes recommended by the Kenyan Ministry of Interior and Coordination, the following new procedures are being instituted:

- 1. All foreigners wishing to work in Kenya should have an approved work permit <u>before</u> arrival in Kenva.
- 2. Foreigners who need to renew their work permit should submit their application for renewal at least 4 months before expiry of their current permit.
- 3. Committees will be formed to consider special pass and dependent pass in the same manner as has been for the work permit.

This means that the previous practice where a foreign national could potentially engage in workrelated activities, holding only a valid tourist visa, as the work permit application is being processed will no longer be possible. The Government of Kenya is yet to issue official circular explaining the changes. The embassy shall relay this information as soon as this is made available.
