




Second highest growth in East African region ...

FDI/GDP in 2016












Public debt to GDP (%)











Rwandans under 30 years old twice as likely to have fluency than those over 65 years old


English as instruction language (from lower primary onwards) was introduced in 2008



Rwanda provides the key components required by top tier BPO players

Rwanda is **connected to global broadband** through 3 main fiber optic cable routes out of the country

- Kigali \rightarrow Gatuna, Rwanda \rightarrow Mombasa, Kenya
- Kigali \rightarrow Kagitumba, Rwanda \rightarrow Mombasa, Kenya
- Kigali \rightarrow Rusumo, Rwanda \rightarrow Dar es Salaam, Tanzania

Rwanda is equipped with **BPO industry standard** technology to provide fast, reliable communication

- Redundancy: routes have 2+ lines and Ring Topology
- Routes to Kagitumba and Rusumo are both underground and overhead (along power lines)
- MPLS¹: connect WANs² between onshore/offshore

The network is connected to the rest of the world through submarine cables operated by **Seacom**


